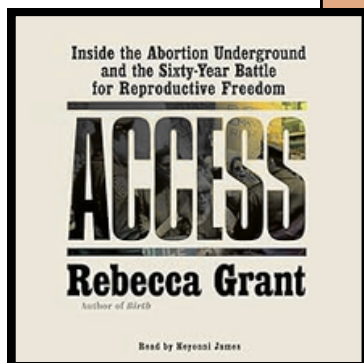

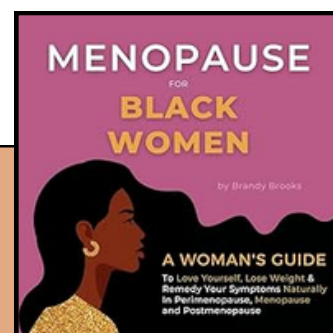

This book tells it all - from the side of women fighting for their right to their own bodily integrity. No one has the right to put their laws on our bodies!

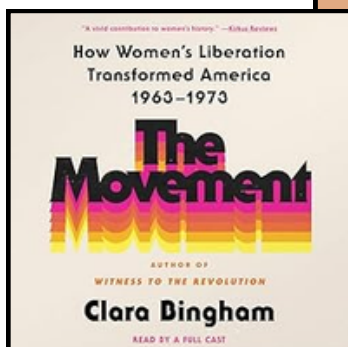
